Anglo-Saxons & Scots

English

Our main text this term will be 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe' by C.S. Lewis. We will be using the text as a stimulus to writing our own narrative set in another world.

Towards the end of the term, we will write poetry based on 'The Jabberwocky'.

Maths

For the rest of the Spring Term, our maths focus will be fractions and decimals.

History

Our history learning this term will have a focus on the period of the Anglo-Saxons and Scots. The children will consider the sources of information from this period and how this differs from previous eras. They will be introduced to the Vikings ready for our next history unit.

Art

Our focus artist will be Georges Seurat and the children will learn about the technique of pointillism: culminating in their own pointillism artwork.

RE/PSHE

In R.E. we will be finding out about the Christian concept of Salvation. We will explore the question: Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

In PSHE, our theme will be Healthy Me! We will explore what we can do to keep ourselves fit and healthy.

Computing

In Computing we will be manipulating digital images and reflecting on the impact of changes and whether the required process is fulfilled.
