Home Learning optional projects

If you would like to, please choose one project and bring it in on the first day back after the October half term.

Option A

History- we are learning about Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and their impact on nursing.

Create a poster or face file about Mary Seacole and/or Florence Nightingale. Think about who they were, what nursing was like in the 1800s and how they changed nursing. Your poster can include writing, drawings, print outs from the internet (with adult support), collage materials.....

Option B

Science- we are learning about uses of everyday materials and how they are suitable to different purposes.

Create a poster or fact file to explore the scientist Charles Macintosh- what did he invent? What did he discover about how materials are suitable for different purposes?

Option C

Art- we will be printing techniques to create a block print inspired by the work of artist William Morris.

Can you choose an object to practise your still life sketching, using William Morris' approach as inspiration?
Can you create a cardboard printing block to produce a pattern inspired by William Morris?
